deliberately rereading the text for specific details (Boyles, 2012) a mini-lesson, work time, & reflection (Heuser, 2000)

Visible Reading



micro-lessons focused on reading strategies, collaboratively constructing meaning, & debriefing the process

3 Parts of Visible Reading



1. The Micro-Lesson

I read aloud a small section of the text to students. When I see a difficult sentence structure, I model how I would approach the sentence.

I do not explain the text's meaning to the students.

2. Collaborative Construction



After modeling, I allow students to apply the strategy to the sentence in question.

Students collaborate to create meaning using the strategy from the micro-lesson.



3. Debrief

At the end of the lesson, I ask students to recount all the strategies they used to help them create meaning.

Take Aways



- 1. ELs can learn to read difficult, on-grade texts by learning the habits that close readers employ.
- 2. Teachers can use a workshop approach to teach close-reading skills.
- Process-based teaching empower ELs to internalize complicated skills.
