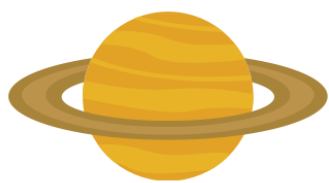
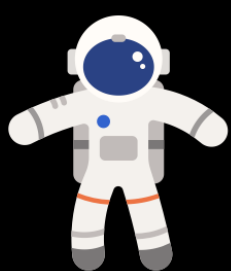


Teaching ELLs to Revise Writing

The goal of this article is to share a process that explicitly teaches ELs to use a framework for revising.

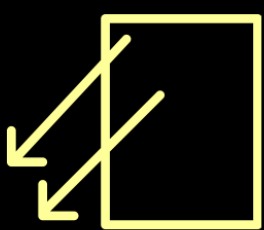


A framework that breaks down the skill of revising into distinct tasks. Inspired by Kelly Gallagher's STAR Revision model (2006).



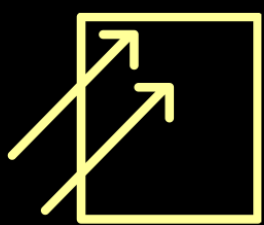
Substitute

Repeated words
Unclear verbs & descriptions
Pronouns for proper nouns (& vice versa)



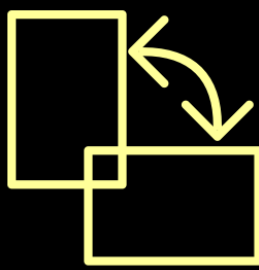
Take out

Opinions that cannot be supported
Information disconnected to the topic
Ideas that contradict the main argument



Add

Textual details to explain the idea
Evidence from the text to support your opinions
Information related to who, where, what, when, how, why

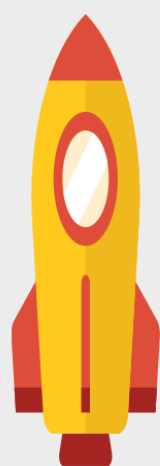


Rearrange

Move ideas to make a connection
Move details to show order of events
Move ideas to show degree (ie: good, better, best)

The Process

1. Select a text for revision
2. Model only 1 aspect of STAR revision
3. Practice Peer-Revising
4. Metacognitive Thinking
5. Teach another aspect of STAR



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
